

Statement on Human Trafficking and Slavery

As a responsible corporate citizen, Sprint shares the global concerns related to human trafficking and slavery. In general, these practices can involve one person or a group of people holding another person or group of people and forcing them into servitude. Such crimes are reported to impact millions upon millions of victims per year (www.state.gov/g/tip/rls/tjrpt/2011/).

Sprint is firmly opposed to human trafficking and slavery and will not knowingly tolerate either practice.

Sprint includes in its agreements with its Suppliers a requirement that the Suppliers agree to conduct business in an ethical manner that is consistent with the [Sprint Code of Supplier Conduct](#). Furthermore, Suppliers are required to comply with all relevant federal, state and local laws, including those related to human trafficking and slavery. Sprint employees can use the company's confidential Ethics Helpline and Employee Helpline to report actions which may violate company policies and /or laws or regulations, including any account of human trafficking or slavery.
